DIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Bankruptcy Law Section for the State Bar of Texas is offering a **\$2,500 scholarship** and **admission to the Annual Jay L. Westbrook Bankruptcy Conference** to diverse law students who are committed to pursuing a career in the bankruptcy/insolvency field.

Criteria for eligibility:

- The scholarship program is open to 2L and 3L law students who are racially, ethnically, or economically diverse, disabled, or identify as LGBTQ+ or female. While financial need is not required, it will be considered.
- The candidate must demonstrate a commitment to pursuing a career as a bankruptcy attorney in the State of Texas.

Application requirements:

The Bankruptcy Law Section welcomes all students who meet the above criteria to apply. Applicants will be assessed based on the following criteria:

- A completed application.
- A personal statement discussing (a) (i) the hurdles that the applicant has faced as a result of their diverse status and/or (ii) the applicant's commitment to diversity and inclusion, and (b) the applicant's interest in bankruptcy law.

Application deadline and instructions:

To be considered eligible, interested applicants must submit a completed application, along with personal statement, via mail or email by **October 15, 2021**. The scholarship winner and other applicants will be notified of the results in the early fall. Address submissions to:
